



Open Space Committee starts work.

Over the past ten years, the Mendon Foundation, Inc. has worked diligently to preserve, protect and enhance the scenic, natural, recreational and structural resources in the Town of Mendon. In recent years 148 acres of land have been donated to the oh my Foundation for preservation and conservation. Through our partnership with the federal wetlands and warm weather grass programs, our acreage has become part of the open space plan for the Town of Mendon.

In order to provide stewardship standards and expand various conservation and preservation programs, the Open Space, Land Acquisition and Stewardship Committee was established in January, 2003. The mission of the Committee is the conservation and preservation of open space; acquisition of land through donation and conservation easement; and stewardship of the Foundation's holdings. The committee is comprised of the President, Carl Foss, two members of the Board of Directors, Wayne Gilman and Arlene Cluff and many enthusiastic volunteers who are members of the Mendon Foundation. The tasks of the committee are varied from development of programs in land acquisition, conservation easement, stewardship, wetlands, warm weather

grasses, timber management, conservation and preservation of open space and parcels; to community education, fundraising, acquisition of grants and marketing strategies. The members bring many years of expertise in the areas of former Town of Mendon Environmental Conservation Board and Open Space, Parks and Recreation Master Plan members; conservation and preservation; conservation easement and land management; timber management; marketing; legal, business and teaching experience; and real estate. Lehigh Valley Trail work commences this summer.

The County Project Engineer reported that RUC Construction of Bergen, NY was the low bidder for the trail work which includes: clean and grub the entire trail, refurbish the six bridges, and complete a trail section of 3/4 mile from the Genesee Greenway Trail on the west through bridge #3 over the Lakeville, Avon, Livonia RR. The bid was very favorable compared to the engineeer's estimate and RUC indicated they would complete their work by mid-July, well in

advance of the contract requirements. The notice to proceed is June 9.

If RUC can adhere to the schedule, the Towns of Rush and Mendon will have large sections of the trail available to start their work in July as well. This will involve site preparation, surfacing, signage, landscaping, parking lots, etc. It is planned the Towns will begin at the east end (Mendon) and complete approximately 50% of the work this year, with completion expected in 2004.







The Open Space, Land Acquisition and Stewardship Committee is promoting a native tree and shrub sale. Proceeds from the sale will benefit the Mendon Foundation's preservation and conservation of open space and land acquisition, conservation easement and stewardship programs. Here is a perfect way to support the Mendon Foundation, while preserving open space by enhancing your property with native species. Natural landscaping and woodland gardening is a way for you to protect your backyard environment and improve wildlife habitat. Seeds for these native, unusual and rare species are collected in Western New York and grown at White Oak Nursery in Canandaigua, NY. The trees and shrubs are native to the region and will survive and thrive in natural areas. Seedlings in 3 5/8" tree bands are one to two years old. Seedlings in 5x8" tree bands are 2 to 3 year old transplants.

MENDON FOUNDATION MARKS 10 YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY.

The Mendon Foundation, a not-for-profit land trust, celebrated its 10th anniversary in May. Carl Foss, the Foundation's President, stated that

"Over the last 10 years the Foundation's volunteers have worked hard to enhance the natural resources in the Town of Mendon. Our goal is to preserve open space in order to enhance property values and contribute to the outstanding quality of life that is Mendon."

The Foundation pursues this goal in several different ways.

- 1. We have received 5 gifts of land totalling approximately 150 acres, which are being preserved as open space. Of this amount, at least 110 acres either are, or will be, opened to public use.
- 2. We work with local landowners to restore wetlands and establish warm season grasslands for wildlife habitats.
- 3. In 1995 the Foundation entered into an agreement with the County of Monroe to "develop and maintain" the 15 mile section of the Lehigh Valley Trail that transects Mendon. Working closely with the County, \$1,300,000 in local, county and federal funds were raised and construction of a major upgrade of the entire trail will commence in June. When completed, the trail is expected to provide a significant recreational and economic stimulus for Mendon and Rush.
- 4. Where the Lehigh Valley Trail passes through the Hamlet of Mendon (between Routes 251 and 64), the Foundation is is developing Mendon Station Park. This pedestrian park will be an outstanding and unique facility, benefitting both trail users and the local community.
- 5. Believing that our children represent the future of our community, our volunteers also maintain the Mendon Community Playground.
