


### LEHIGH VALLEY TRAIL PROGRESSING ON SCHEDULE

Spring is here and completion of the trail work is underway.

In a week or two, yellow gates will be installed on the Trail at each road crossing in Mendon. In addition, boulders and ballards will be added across the full width of the Trail, as needed. The Gates will provide access for emergency and maintenance vehicles, the only vehicles permitted on the Trail. Gate installation for Rush intersections are planned for later

this summer.

The bridge work is scheduled to be completed in June. After the Rush - Mendon Highway Departments complete the rough grading and drainage improvements, they will lay down the cinder for the multi-use trail, followed by the two-inch thick stone dust surface. General cleanup, sign installation and hydro-seeding will complete the project. We hope to have the official Trail opening this coming Fall.



As shown in the cross-section above, the east-west portion of the Trail between the Victor town line and the Genesee River consists of two parallel trails.

The trail design, left to right, consists of:

- a. A 5' wide shoulder of rough grass.
- b. A 5' rough grass Horse Trail.
- c. 5' of mowed grass separation between the trails.
- d. A 10' wide Multi-use trail, surfaced with stone dust.
- e. A 5' shoulder of mowed grass.

Both trails are raised, with slightly sloping shoulders, to provide for improved drainage.

It should be noted that about 70% of the Trail right-of-way will remain in an undisturbed natural state.

The Mendon Cycle Smith, located in the Mendon Village Commons, opened for business on April 1st. Owner Craig Smith brings 20 years of experience in the biking business to Mendon and the Lehigh Valley Trail. Craig grew up in the area and presently lives in Ionia. He spent over 6 years working on bikes and skis at Lake Placid, before putting in 8 years at Park Avenue Bike Shop, most recently, as its Service Manager.

The new Mendon shop will offer:

- Complete service on bicycles and skis.
- -Used and consignment bikes for sale.
- -Custom built bikes.
- -Rentals, for use in the community and on the Trail.

Several trail studies suggest that 65% to 75% of those using the Lehigh

Valley Trail will be bicyclists. A bike shop, featuring both rentals and repair services and located only a few steps from the trail, is a valuable addition, benefiting both trail users and the community.

The Mendon Foundation would like to welcome The Mendon Cycle Smith to the community and wish Craig the best in his new endeavor.

We believe that this is only the first of several new businesses that will be attracted to the area as the Lehigh Valley Trail continues to develop.





#### Construction to Begin On Storage Building for Maintenance Equipment.

At a public meeting held on February 26, the Mendon Foundation, having received tentative approval from the Monroe County, presented plans for a 26'x 26' Lehigh Valley Trail maintenance equipment storage building. On March 10, the Foundation also met with the Mendon Planning Board, giving them a progress update on both the Trail and building. Construction is now scheduled to start later this month. Located between the trail and the south-west corner of the RG&E substation #115, the building will be home to the Foundation's new Kubota 34 hp. tractor, bush-hog, mower and other trail related equipment.

The building's design is reminiscent of the old Mendon station, incorporating such features as a modified hip roof with windows in the gable ends, a large roof overhang, and side trim design similar to that of the station. The building sides will be stained light green



with dark green trim and the roof will have gray-green architectural shingles. We in Mendon are very fortunate to have local people who are willing to give generously of their time and talent to benefit the community. Tim Schiefen has been the volunteer coordinator for this project, as well as providing some of the building material. In addition to Tim's contribution, architect George Baker donated the design and

plans, John Hastings has agreed to dig the footings; Corry Gates offered to build the structure, as well as supply some materials, and Don Brault has volunteered to do the shingling. Also, several local residents have offered to stain the building when it is completed. The Foundation would like to extend its deep appreciation to all those who are helping to create this community asset, at no expense to the tax payers.



#### It Takes Equipment to Maintain a Trail

With the Lehigh Valley Trail scheduled for completion this year, the Foundation has spent the winter working on identifying, and securing funding for, the necessary equipment, with which, to fulfill it's trail maintenance obligations.

To date we have raised \$15,300 from two grants, three individual gifts and the trade-in value of our old tractor. In addition we have two grant applications outstanding which total \$13,300 and we have received contractor and volunteer labor commitments estimated to exceed \$18,000.

These commitments will allow the Foundation to:

- a. Build a 26'x26' Maintenance Equipment Storage Building.
- b. Upgrade to a two year old, 34 hp, Kubota Tractor and 5' bush hog.
- c. Acquire a Ferris or equivalent commercial mower.

There are however, a number of smaller items still needed.

Although we have made great strides over the past winter in securing the major pieces of equipment to maintain the trail, there are still a number of smaller items that are needed. These include the following:

raffle with the support of the Mendon-Honeoye Falls community.





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
#### **JACK KREBS**

1936 -2003

On October 7, 2003 the Town of Mendon lost one of its long time residents. Jack Krebs loved the outdoors...Mendon's open spaces and woods, the Springwater tree farm, the Adirondack Mountains and Sanibel Island. He was his happiest hiking through the woods or hunting with his dog Annie. A retiree from Eastman Kodak, Jack turned his love of the outdoors into a rewarding hobby. In 1991 he became a certified NYS Master Forest Owner at Cornell University. Jack used this skill to manage his own tree farm of 430 acres in Springwater, NY and to evaluate forests and woodlots of private landowners. As a result of his innovative program on his property, he became 1994 NYS Tree Farmer of the Year. This tree farm is now under conservation easement under the stewardship of the Finger Lakes Land Trust.

Jack served on the Town of Mendon Conservation Board for 8 years as the expert in tree management and harvesting. Recently, Jack has been an active member on the Mendon Foundation's Open Space, Land Acquisition and Stewardship Committee. He worked tirelessly until his untimely passing in developing a conservation easement program for the Foundation. Jack also evaluated and recommended sound tree management advice for all the parcels owned by the Mendon Foundation.


#### An update on the Old Oak Tree on 15A.

To date, 35 contributions have been received ranging from \$5 to \$100. Including a special contribution from the Mendon Foundation, of \$250, we now have \$950 to devote to saving this magnificent specimen.

This Spring, High Falls Tree Service will remove dead branches, correctively prune, and raise the bottom of the crown overhanging Rt. 15A. This will require a bucket-equipped truck and traffic control.

We have enlisted the expertise of Dr. Daniel F. Marion, a tree pathologist and professor in Tree and Ornamental Plant Health at SUNY. Dr. Marion's current assessment is the tree has a bright and healthy future with proper care. His plan includes a thorough check of the levels of road salt in root area soil and any infections the tree may have. . including inspection of a seam in the main trunk. He will also encourage bark closure where needed.
